

## The Broadway Gallery Membership Information Short Version

The Broadway Gallery is a cooperative gallery founded in 1982 with the mission of displaying, selling and developing quality artwork from Southwest Washington. The following information is a brief outline of the types of memberships, including what costs and requirements are involved for each membership. This is just an overview. ### FULL MEMBERSHIP: (B MEMBER)

- Monthly dues of \$30.
- Pays 20% commission on sales
- Staffs the gallery 4 or 5 shifts @ 4 hours each per month (actual time amount may vary)
- Fulfills a committee job (all jobs help maintain the gallery or keep us in business)
- Attends monthly gallery meeting the first Tuesday of the month at 4 PM
- Helps with gallery rehangs three or more times a year: these take a day each.
- Provide new artwork regularly, rotate your older art work and provide an inventory list of work.
- After a 3-month training & probationary period, pays a one-time membership fee of \$125. (fee may be paid in installments arranged with the dues chairperson.)

### INTERMEDIATE MEMBERSHIP: (H MEMBER)

- Pay \$35.00 dues per month and a 30 % commission on sales
- Staff the gallery about 2 shifts per month with extra during holiday season.
- After the completion of the 3-month training and probationary period, pay the one-time membership fee of \$125.00 (fee may be paid in installments arranged with the dues chairperson.)
- Participate in all re-hangs, (about 3-4 times per year for a full day)
- Rotate your artwork a minimum of every six months to keep the Gallery fresh.

### CONSIGNMENT MEMBERSHIP: (C MEMBER)

- Pay \$40.00 dues per month and a 35% commission on sales
- After the completion of the 3-month probationary period, pay the one-time membership fee of \$125.00 (fee may be paid in installments arranged with the dues chairperson).
- Provide new artwork regularly, rotate your older artwork and provide an inventory list of work.

### TEACHING Classes:

- All members pay 20% commission on class fees for classes taught in the gallery classroom or advertised through the gallery.
- Non-members who would like to teach in the gallery will need to jury their work and meet the same quality and originality standards as gallery members. Non-members recruit and enroll their own students. At the time the classroom is reserved, a rental fee of \$50 for a 1-3 hour class and a \$150 refundable deposit are due. Classes are held during normal business hours, and the teacher provides all refreshments.

## STEPS TO JOIN THE BROADWAY GALLERY

- Carefully read and fill out the application. Turn it in by the 4th Monday of the month to jury on the 4<sup>th</sup>. Thursday of that month.
- Prepare your jury pieces according to the application requirements.
